A Thanksgiving Tradition

The Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City has been a holiday tradition since 1924.

Along with floats, brass bands and entertainers, the early parades included animals from the Central Park Zoo.

Giant helium balloons replaced the live animals in 1927. Felix the Cat, a dinosaur and a dog were among the first characters.

The parade was halted for three years during World War II, and Macy's donated 650 pounds of balloon rubber to the war effort.

There are more than 8,000 parade participants.

Around 3.5 million people line the city streets to watch the parade, and about 50 million watch on TV.

Apple Cranberry Cobbler

Ingredients:

- Cooking spray
- 3 Gala apples, peeled, cored and cut into 1/2-inch thick slices
- 1 1/2 cups fresh or frozen cranberries
- 2 teaspoons lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 container (10.2 ounces) refrigerated homestyle biscuits, quartered
- 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- 2 tablespoons coarse or sparkling sugar

Directions:

Heat oven to 375° F. Spray medium-size baking dish with cooking spray.

In large bowl, combine apple slices, cranberries, lemon juice and vanilla. In small bowl, combine granulated sugar, cornstarch and cinnamon. Stir into fruit mixture. Spoon mixture into prepared dish. Cover with foil.

Bake 40 to 45 minutes or until fruit begins to bubble. Remove from oven.

Toss biscuit pieces in melted butter and distribute evenly over fruit, pressing biscuits down slightly into filling. Sprinkle biscuits with coarse sugar. Return to oven and bake 18 to 20 minutes or until biscuits are golden brown and filling is bubbly. Remove from oven. Cool before serving.

Hurricane Season: Are You Ready?

Hurricane season is June 1 through Nov. 30 and typically includes six hurricanes. A hurricane watch is issued whenever a hurricane becomes a threat to coastal areas. If a hurricane warning is issued, precautionary actions should begin immediately. In the event of a tropical storm or hurricane, conserve supplies and resources and plan for up to five days without water or electricity.

- An ample supply of clean water is top priority; store one or more gallons of water per person, per day.
- Designate a ground-level family gathering space that has no windows and does not share any outside walls (if possible).
- Have a battery-powered radio and extra batteries on hand.
- Keep mosquito repellent available.

3 Things You Need to Know

Cooking a turkey this month? Here are a few things to remember:

- 1) Plan for about 1 1/2 pounds of turkey per person. If you are feeding eight people, you'll want a 12-pound bird. Choose a bigger turkey if you want plenty of leftovers!
- 2) Don't stuff with stuffing. Food safety experts suggest baking the stuffing in a separate pan. Loosely fill the turkey with a cut-up onion and some herbs.
- 3) Use a digital meat thermometer so you know when the bird is done. Insert the thermometer in the thickest part of the turkey around the thigh, avoiding the bone. At 165° F, it's ready to come out of the oven. Let the turkey rest at least 15 minutes before carving.

NOVEMBER

1917: Made up of five Canadian teams, the National Hockey League is created in Montreal.

1926: U.S. Route 66 is officially established. The 2,400-mile two-lane highway from Chicago to Los Angeles became a legendary east-west link.

1931: Homemaker Irma Rombauer self-publishes her favorite recipes in “The Joy of Cooking.” The classic cookbook has since sold over 18 million copies.

1941: President Franklin D. Roosevelt signs a bill proclaiming the fourth Thursday in November as the official Thanksgiving holiday.

1954: The U.S. Marine Corps Memorial is dedicated in Arlington, Va. The monument depicts the raising of the American flag at the 1945 Battle of Iwo Jima.

1967: With a cover price of 25 cents, the first issue of Rolling Stone magazine goes on sale in San Francisco.

1972: In response to an international energy crisis, the speed limit on all U.S. highways is lowered to 55 mph to help conserve gasoline.

1984: Fred Rogers, of the children’s TV series “Mister Rogers’ Neighborhood,” presents one of his sweaters to the Smithsonian’s National Museum of American History.

1997: Disney’s “The Lion King” opens as a Broadway musical.

2010: A groundbreaking ceremony is held for George W. Bush’s presidential library in University Park, Texas.

2017: Britain’s Prince Harry and American actress Meghan Markle announce their engagement.
